## English

Writing: biography writing of David Attenborough; information text based on Plastic Pollution; acrostic poems about nature; rhyming poems about the planet.

Reading: Recognise simple recurring literary language in stories and poetry; using known sounds to decode a range of texts; comprehension to focus on retrieval, predictions, vocabulary and inference - preparation for SATS.

Spelling: use set 2 and set 3 sounds to spell words; spell common exception and high frequency/tricky words.

Handwriting: correct letter formation with consistent and correct joins.

## Position and Direction

Year 1: I can describe turns in both directions using key language; I can describe movement using language such as up, down, left, right; I can describe position using key vocabulary.
Year 2: I can describe movement using language such as forwards, backwards, up, down, left, right, clockwise and anti-clockwise; I can use my knowledge of movement and turns to describe directions; I can use my understanding of turns to create and describe complex patterns.

## Measurement

Year 1: I can measure length, height, mass, volume and capacity using standard and non-standard units of measure; I can compare and order a range of different measurements.
Year 2: I can measure using standard and non-standard units; I can use centimetres, metres, millilitres, litres, grams and kilograms; I can compare and order measurements accurately; I can measure the temperature.
