## Autumn Term 2016

As mentioned in the information sent with the annual permission slip, we now start school at 8.55am, registers will close at 9.00 and the first lesson will start then. Many thanks to those parents who bring their children by car who are now arriving more promptly.

We are delighted with the enthusiastic start that all of our new pupils have made to this exciting, new school year. We want you to feel part of our school community, so please let us know how we can be of help.

A warm welcome to our new parents throughout the school. We hope you may be able to attend the next P.T.A. meeting on Monday  $19^{th}$  September in school at 3.00pm and get to know other parents. (A crèche will be available)

R - Y2 continue to have free school meals as part of the new government initiative.

Lunch costs this term have changed. As you are aware there is an increase to £2.20 per day and Y5 £2.50 per day.

For Y 3 and 4 the cost is £11.00 per week. £72.60 for the first half of the term, £74.80 for the second half and £147.40 for the whole term.

For y5 the cost is £12.50 per week. £82.50 for the first half of the term, £85.00 for the second half and £167.50 for the whole term.

Please pay milk money, £12.00 per child, on Monday if you have not already done so. Milk remains free for all the children who are under 5.



There will be a total of 13 swimming lessons this term at a cost of £4.00 per session. We are now subsidising swimming ourselves. We are very grateful to those parents who pay on a regular basis and would ask those parents that are struggling to at least make a donation.

The facility of large arrears on lunch money that are settled at the end of the term is, unfortunately, no longer available. Lunches will need to be paid on a weekly basis, or half termly / termly up front. Any lunches not taken will be credited to the next term.

All money needs to be sent in to school on a Monday morning in a clearly marked envelope detailing what you are paying – please do not send in loose cash with a child who has just been told 'give it to Kathy', or cheques that have no indication of what they are paying! In future any payments received like this will be returned as they take too long to process.

All cheques, unless advised otherwise, need to be payable to Northumberland County Council.

You are able to pay in school or over the phone with your credit or debit card. This facility is only available on a Tuesday.

We have started our block of cricket coaching with Tom Vickers and now have a cricket club after school on a Tuesday. We still have a few places left. Please speak to Kathy if your child is interested.

The Fairtrade healthy tuck shop is open on Thursday lunchtimes, so that snacks and drinks can be purchased to eat after swimming. Geobars cost 50p and fruit juice 50p

We continue to be able to donate the proceeds to our linked school Kazinga in Uganda. The Y4 & 5's will be responsible for running it.

Please have a PE kit in school. Always bring a coat. Don't forget your kit if you are swimming on Thursdays. Please stay away from school for 48 hours if you have been sick or have diarrhoea.



'Together Time' an afterschool club which involves bible based stories arts and crafts for R - Y5, starts again next Monday. There are a few spaces left - please speak to Kathy. (If you were part of this club last term it will be assumed you are continuing unless you have already spoken to Kathy.)

Your child's access to all of our online resources, eg. Active Learn and School 360, is all done now by one username and password. This is usually username: first name . surname, passwords start with a capital letter and end in 1. Your child will be given a reminder card next week.
