English

Maths

Addition and Subtraction: adding with and without exchanges; subtracting with and without exchanges; estimate answers, methods for checking answers.

Length, Perimeter and Area: recognise equivalent lengths; add and subtract lengths; measure perimeter on a grid; measure perimeter of rectangles; measure area; compare area.

Multiplication and Division: multiply and divide by 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10 (Year 3), multiply and divide by 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11 and 12 (Year 4); recall times tables up to 12x12.

History

How and why did invaders come to Britain?

Find out how Anglo-Saxon kingdoms were organised; know reasons why invasion and settlement happen; learn about the Viking invasion of Lindisfarne; understand how Viking beliefs influenced their actions; understand how Viking settlement impacted Britain.

Geography

What impact did invaders have on Northumberland?

Understand why Britain was invaded and settled; understand the impact of location on settlement defence and daily life; describe some key features of human and physical geography in the UK; know why people trade goods; know some reasons for land conflict.

DT

Christmas decorations

Research and evaluate existing fabric products; practise textiles and sewing techniques; design a product; make a product based on design criteria; evaluate products against design criteria and suggest how it could be improved.

<u>Science</u>

Forces and Magnets

Describe and give examples of forces; compare how objects move on different surfaces; test and group materials based on being magnetic or nonmagnetic; observe how magnets attract or repeleach other and relate this to their magnetic poles.

Explore French Christmas traditions and customs; learn and practise vocabulary associated with Christmas and the Christmas story.

Sequencing Sounds

Programming with Scratch block-code app.

Exploring the Scratch interface and designing a project which converts an algorithm into code.
